Commemorative Partnership Program (Two Types of Funding Available)	The Commemorative Partnership Program (CPP) provides funding to organizations undertaking remembrance initiatives, through a Community Engagement Funding Program and a Community War Memorial Funding Program.	<p>Community Engagement funding supports commemorative activities (e.g. events) or the development of commemorative resources (e.g. learning materials). To be eligible, the project must commemorate the achievements and sacrifices of those who served Canada since Confederation (1867). Eligible recipients are non-profit or for-profit organizations, in Canada or abroad. Organizations can also be provincial, territorial or municipal levels of Canadian government. It must also be of a finite duration, with clear start and end dates. It is strongly recommended that applications be submitted AT LEAST THREE (3) MONTHS before the start date of the proposed project to allow for processing and notification of funding. For example, if the project start date is May 1, the application should be submitted by the first business day of the January deadline.</p> <p>To be considered, applications must be duly completed. Veterans Affairs Canada will acknowledge receipt of applications and may solicit additional information.
